This federally funded scholarship to Germany is a unique opportunity not only to study but also to work in a foreign country. The one-year cultural exchange is designed to give 75 Americans an understanding and knowledge of everyday life in Germany by living with a host family, studying at a German university, and working in a German company or organization. Conceived and funded by the United States Congress and the German Bundestag. The program is designed primarily for those in business, technical, vocational and agricultural fields, although applicants in all fields are encouraged to apply. Strong interest in German and international affairs is essential, although German language skills are not required to apply. Requirements: Participants must be a US citizen or permanent resident between 18 and 24 years old at the start of the program.
