Important: You must have a financial aid application (PROFILE or FAFSA) on file by the deadline. If you do not apply for aid prior to admission and by the published deadlines, you will not be eligible for Smith College grant aid until you complete 32 credits at Smith. Applicants who have financial need, as calculated by Smith College, and who submit the required documents on time will be eligible for Smith need-based financial aid.

- ▶ This policy does not apply to students who applied for aid but were determined to be ineligible.
- ▶ Exceptions to this policy will be considered only if you have a documented family emergency or a drastic change in family circumstances.
- ▶ Students planning to postpone their enrollment must apply for financial aid by the published deadlines at the time they initially apply for admission.

Be sure to observe filing deadlines by allowing enough time for mailing and processing of documents. Deadlines refer to receipt of the forms. If you have problems that might delay your application or questions about forms and procedures, contact us before the deadline by e-mail, phone or mail.

Complete all required forms clearly with the most accurate information available to you, even if you must estimate. If you file with estimated data, make sure that your figures are realistic and as accurate as possible. The student's name and Social Security number or Smith-assigned ID number should appear on all forms and correspondence.

Consult the Smith College publication *Investing in a Smith Education* for details on the determination of need and the awarding of need-based grants, loans and work-study. Smith College meets the full calculated need of eligible aid applicants whose files are complete by the appropriate deadline.

CSS 2011–12 PROFILE Form

- Register for a customized PROFILE application at www.collegeboard.com or by calling the toll free registration line at 1-800-778-6888.
- List Smith College, CSS code 3762, during the registration process.

Free Application for Federal Student Aid, 2011–12 (FAFSA)

- All applicants must complete the 2011–12 FAFSA after January 1, 2011. We suggest that you file the FAFSA by January 31, 2011.
- List the Smith College federal code 002209 during the application process.
- File the 2011–12 FAFSA online at www.fafsa.ed.gov.

Federal 2010 Income Tax Returns

September (not January) Transfers must submit required documents to the College Board's Imaging and Documentation Service (IDOC) for processing. You will receive instructions from the College Board as to which documents to submit once you have

completed the CSS Profile. Please do not submit duplicate documents to both IDOC and Smith College, as this will delay the processing of awards. January transfers will send required supporting documents to Student Financial Services at Smith College.

- Submit signed copies of all 2010 federal income tax returns for your parents and their spouses/partners. Include all pages and schedules.
- Submit copies of all W-2 forms for your parents and their spouses/partners.
- If your parents or their spouses/partners are not required to file a 2010 federal tax return, they must submit an IRS nonfiler's statement. This form is available on our Web site at www.smith.edu/finaid.
- Submit a signed copy of your (student) 2010 federal income tax return including all pages and schedules.
- If you are not required to file a 2010 federal tax return, submit an IRS nonfiler statement to Smith. This form is available on our Web site at www.smith.edu/finaid.

Required if Appropriate

CSS Noncustodial Parent Profile

- If your parents are divorced or separated or were never married, both must provide financial information. The parent with whom you live should complete the PROFILE and FAFSA forms. Your other parent (noncustodial)

should complete the CSS Noncustodial Parent Profile and submit it to College Board along with a signed copy of his or her most recent federal tax return (including all schedules and W-2 forms), as well as the federal tax returns and W-2s of his/her spouse or partner. This form is available at <https://ncprofile.collegeboard.com>.

CSS Business/Farm Supplement and business tax returns

- If your family participates (actively or passively) in a business (sole proprietorship, partnership or corporation), a Business Supplement must be submitted for each business entity. The Business/Farm Supplement is available as part of the PROFILE application process or it may be downloaded and printed from the CSS Web site or our Web site.

Business/Farm Tax Returns

- If the business is a corporation or partnership, attach copies of the most recent business tax returns (IRS 1065; IRS 1120; IRS 1120S; IRS K-1).
- Sole proprietors and farmers must include IRS Schedules C and/or F of their most recent IRS returns.

Trust Information Form

- If you or your parents are beneficiaries of a trust, you must complete a trust information form that will be sent to you by Student Financial Services. The form is also available on our Web site.

** Divorced or separated parents must also submit copies of their current spouse's or partner's tax returns and W-2s, if applicable.

- ▶ Retain a copy of all documents you submit.
- ▶ Please be sure all required signatures are on all forms, including federal tax returns.
- ▶ Please print applicant name and Social Security number or Smith-assigned ID number on all documents sent to Student Financial Services.
- ▶ Please detach this instruction sheet and retain for your files.
- ▶ We suggest that you file forms well in advance of published deadlines.
