Susan Abulhawa's first novel, *Mornings in Jenin* (Bloomsbury 2010) is an international bestseller that has been translated into 26 languages. Susan was born to Palestinian refugees and grew up in Kuwait, Jordan, and Jerusalem before coming to the United States at the age of 13. She is a biologist by training and is also the founder of Playgrounds for Palestine, a nonprofit NGO dedicated to upholding the Right to Play for Palestinian children living in Palestine and in refugee camps elsewhere. Susan's essays have appeared worldwide in print and online media.
