

LTC David D. Rabb, M.A., L.I.C.S.W., A.C.S.W. - VA Medical Center Menlo Park

Lieutenant Colonel Rabb is currently assigned the Western Regional Medical Command at Fort Lewis, WA and attached to the VA Palo Alto Health Care System. As the Coordinator, Continuum of Care and Transition, LTC Rabb's goal is to facilitate the continuity of care and joint operations between Military Treatment Facilities, Warrior Transition Units, Army Community Based Hospital Community Organizations and VA Medical Centers/Polytrauma Rehabilitation Centers to ensure that active duty service members' clinical and administrative needs are addressed. Strategically located at the Palo Alto VA Medical Center, LTC Rabb's area of operations extends through six states (Alaska, Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Nevada and California). He has been serving as the Western Region Medical Command Seamless Transition Military Liaison since July, 2007. Having served four years of active duty as infantryman in the United States Marine Corps, LTC Rabb has completed 19 years in the United States Army Reserves. From 1989 to 2007, he served in the 785th Medical Company, Combat Stress Control (the last four years in the unit, he served as the Commander). The primary mission of the 785th is to provide combat stress control services and treat soldiers with combat stress, grief and loss, and battle fatigue. The unit returned from a one-year deployment in Iraq in February 2005. Due to his unit many accomplishments in Iraq, his unit earned the U.S. Army Meritorious Unit Citation. For his leadership, LTC Rabb is the receipt of the Bronze Star Medal from the United States Marine Corps.
