**I–A Supervising, Teaching and Presenting**

Are you interested in supervising, teaching and/or presenting? Whether you are already engaged in one or more of these, or are looking to take that next step in your career, this workshop is designed to help you identify opportunities, learn from your colleagues, and discuss the challenges as well as benefits of supervising, teaching, and/or presenting your work.

**I–B Connecting with Clinicians of Color**

This will be an opportunity for alumni of color to connect with one another, discuss relevant resources and/or concerns pertaining to the social work profession, and exchange ideas with one another.

**I–C Private Practice: Networking and Information for Building a Private Practice**

Are you considering starting a private practice? Have you opened a private practice within the last few years? Join with others in the area to exchange information pertinent to building a private practice, including topics such as billing insurances, HIPPA requirements, getting and making referrals, finding office space, on-going supervision and any other topics you bring forth.

**I – D Networking 101: Finding and Keeping Fulfilling Work**

Workshop Description: Simply put, networking is building relationships. Learn how to develop and maintain a network that will serve as a foundation for a lifetime of professional development. Use your strengths as a social worker to build a variety of connections and tap the hidden job market.

**Workshop Session II**

**II–A Social Work Outside the Clinical Setting: Lobbying, Social Work Union Organizing and Taking Action**

Social justice is the foundation of the Social Work profession, yet there are very few jobs that combine clinical social work with taking action on a larger scale. This workshop will provide the opportunity to discuss the role of the social worker outside the clinical setting,

connect with others also passionate about social justice, and exchange ideas and information about how to become more involved in political and social action.

### **II–B Finding Supervision: How to Continue Your Education through Individual or Peer Supervision**

Continuing one's development as a clinical social worker through on-going individual or peer supervision is a growing challenge as social workers face increasing productivity demands, and a growing shortage of time and resources. Finding quality supervision beyond graduation and beyond licensure at the independent level can be both difficult and expensive. Participants in this workshop will discuss the challenges and rewards of on-going supervision, how to identify when you need more than what you are getting, explore what to look for in supervision and in a supervisor and exchange ideas about how to start a peer supervision group.

### **II–C Private Practice: Idea Exchange for Those with Established Private Practices**

A workshop designed for those with established private practices to discuss the challenges that emerge over time in private practice. Topics may include clinical or ethical concerns, how to sustain yourself and your practice over time, receiving and making referrals, seeking consultation, and how to build connections and community while in an often isolating private practice setting. Participants are invited to bring in any concerns, questions, or topics they would like to discuss.

### **II–D Working with Children: Connecting with Colleagues**

Discover what other alumni in the area are working with children and adolescents, take advantage of the opportunity to share resources, information, and ideas with colleagues, and discuss the challenges facing youth, as well as those working with them.
