

Recent Internships in Geneva

- International Union Against Cancer (UICC), Membership Department – student prepared informational mailings on current events in the cancer community for Union members, compiled research and information on current member activities and potential members, and contributed to specific projects.
- Art and History Museum of Geneva – student translated the museum guides, display case information from French to English, researched and wrote short texts about certain collections to be made available to the public.
- Bureau of Archives, International Labor Organization (ILO) –
 - student was responsible for preparing a report on the question of language usage at the ILO since its establishment at the end of WWI.
 - student researched the ILO's work to combat forced labor in developing countries since the end of World War II.
 - student organized and filed documents on Eastern European countries.
 - student researched the ILO's vocational programs in Northern Africa in relation to Northern African countries' development within the last 50 years.
- Policy Coherence Group (ILO) – student worked in the area of sustainable development's impact on employment and researched the impact of green jobs and eco-industries on the job market in developing countries.
- Department of Standards (ILO) - student help update database, contributed to the department's website, and observed diplomatic deliberations in process.
- Gender Equality Bureau (ILO) – student wrote an article and did editorial work for an ILO publication, analyzing and summarizing information for a project donor, and adding data and information into the ILO gender website.
- Bureau of Statistics (ILO) – student was in charge of calculating a statistical indicator for the United Nations Millennium Goals.
- Global Awareness Campaign team of the International Program for the Elimination of Child Labour (IPEC) under the Standards and Fundamental Principles and Rights at Work Department (ILO) – student assisted in planning and organizing activities and events in Geneva for the World Day Against Child Labour 2008, assisted in the research and preparation of ILO/IPEC initiatives relating to human rights education in schools, and contributed to the development of the 12 to 12 Community Portal on child labor by identifying relevant materials to upload to the website.
- Department of Communication and Public Information (ILO) – student organized and labeled photos in their gallery, creating French and English captions for photos taken by an ILO photographer.
- American Citizens Abroad – student helped organize an annual auction, and compiled a list of potential donors, which required personal meetings with potential donors, creating a comprehensive map of Geneva and a list for future soliciting, and ultimately helping to modernize ACA's image.
- Quaker United Nations Office – student wrote reports from the Quaker perspective to various United Nations committees, and attended a human rights commission meeting. Her focus was mostly on women in prison.

- Centre Catholique International de Genève – student worked to assemble a document concerning the Alternative World Water Forum, following her interest in the privatization of water resources.
- NGO Group for the Convention on the Rights of the Child – student reviewed and summarized many country reports on child abuse. Another student attended UN Convention meetings, wrote reports on the sessions of the Committee on the Rights of the Child, and assisted her supervisor with research.
- Jardin Botanique de Genève – student contributed to a research project to grow and study a species of moss that is new to the Geneva area, a project conducted under the supervision of a research scientist in Botany at the Jardin.
- Women in Peacemaking Programme at the International Peace Bureau – student compiled information about peace organizations, translated documents, maintained the organization's website, and helping to organize a conference.
- Département des Arts Appliqués at the Musée d'art et d'histoire – student conducted research on Byzantine art, created bibliographies, and corrected English text for a journal.
- International Office of Médecins Sans Frontières – student created a calendar of international events, updated a contact list, created a press kit and compiled media monitoring standards.
- Women's International League for Peace and Freedom – student searched for and through relevant United Nations documents and compiled an Excel spreadsheet of these materials for her supervisor.
- NGO Group for the Convention of the Rights of the Child – student attended and wrote various analytical reports at sessions of the Convention of the Rights of the Child, a subgroup to the United Nations Commission on Human Rights.
- Global Competitiveness Program of the World Economic Forum - student was a research assistant responsible for the hard data used in the annual Global Competitiveness Report, researching multivariate data on the economic statistics of a range of countries, and creating power point presentations and producing graphs, charts, and excel spreadsheets.
- The United Nations Institute for Disarmament Research – student contributed to a team project applying psychological variables to questions of disarmament.
- Permanent Mission of Republic of Korea for the United Nations - student worked with diplomats, attended meetings and made summaries.
