At Smith, undergraduates conduct research near and far. You can:

Study abroad

Choose from more than 150 programs—in Italy, Japan, Kenya, France, Spain, South Korea, Ghana, England, and more—and make the world your classroom for a semester, a summer, or a year.

Make discoveries

In Smith labs, students tackle real-world challenges—like developing hair-braiding techniques to help ensure medical caps can properly cover different hair textures during imaging scans.

Explore together

Students engage with Smith's centers and initiatives in many ways, including as Mellon Mays Fellows. This fellowship offers research opportunities for students in a variety of fields.

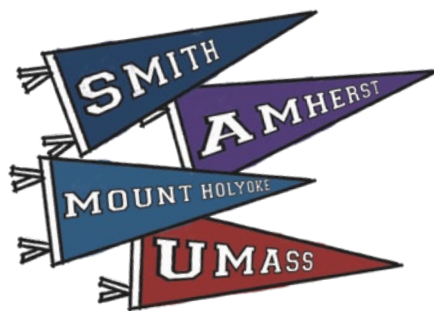

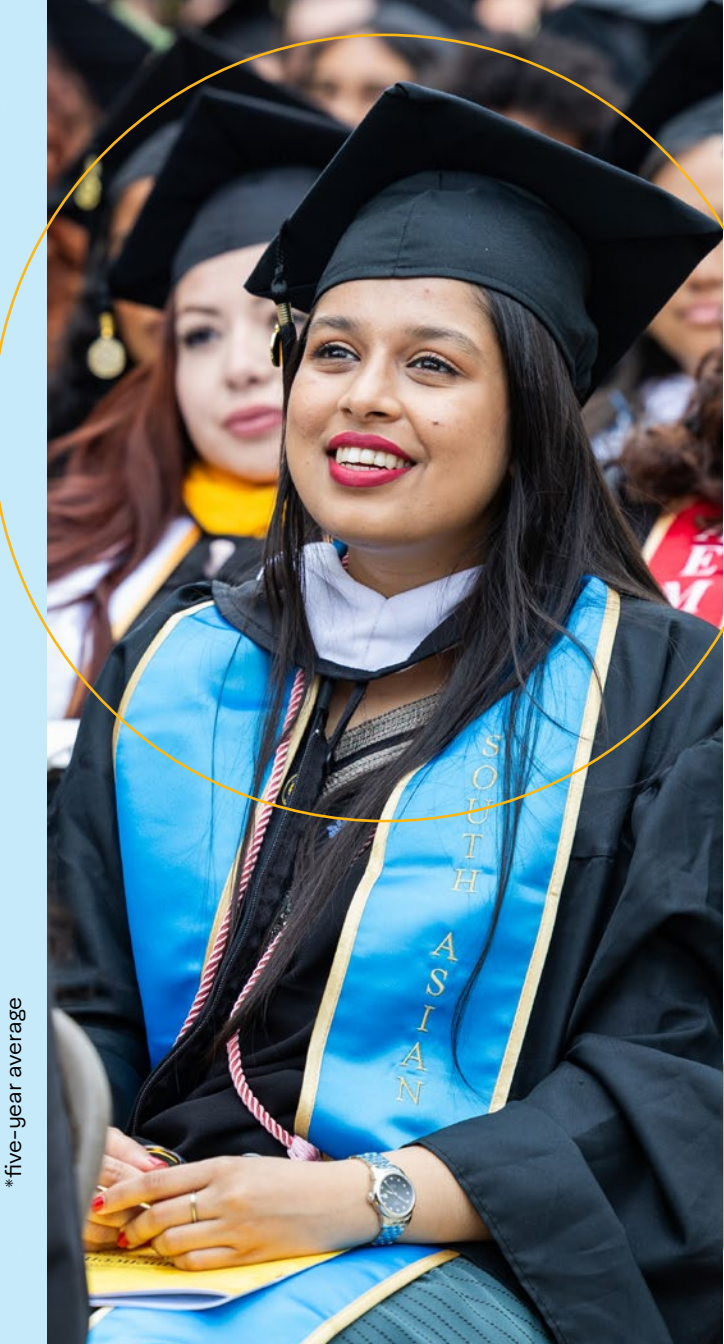
