

ROSENTHAL PROGRAM

Archives and Book Studies Concentration Fellowships and Capstone Research Support

Funded by the Rebecca Samay Rosenthal '07 Fund

Guidelines: Applicants must be enrolled in the Archives Concentration or Book Studies Concentration.

Process: Applications are reviewed by the Rosenthal Committee (Director of Special Collections and Associate Curator of Special Collections in conjunction with the directors of Archives and Book Studies Concentrations as needed).

Rosenthal Fellowships: Successful applicants receive up to \$1,500 for a 100-hour educational internship for work related to their Archives or Book Studies Concentrations. Applicants may work 10 hours per week for one semester, 5 hours per week for two semesters, or 35 hours per week for 3 weeks during January term or the summer.

APPLICATION PROCESS: Applicants must supply a one-page description of their on-campus or off-campus internship, including goals of the internship and a brief schedule. With application, please attach a completed *Archives Concentration Practical Experience Approval Form* or a completed *Book Studies Concentration Internship Approval Form*. Unpaid internships will receive priority.

DEADLINES: November 1 for January and spring internships and March 1 for summer and fall internships. Proposals should be submitted by email to Beth Myers, Director of Special Collections, Neilson Library: emyers@smith.edu

Rosenthal Capstone Research Support: Successful applicants receive up to \$1,000 for travel or other expenses related to their capstone projects in the Archives or Book Studies Concentrations.

APPLICATION PROCESS: A budget must be submitted with a project title and a description of the capstone project to Beth Myers, Director of Special Collections, Neilson Library: emyers@smith.edu

DEADLINE: Open enrollment with no deadline. (Capstone projects are completed in the fall for the Book Studies Concentration and in the spring for the Archives Concentration.)

Rosenthal Internships and Rosenthal Capstone Fellowships may not be combined with Praxis funding.
