Grantor Highlights

The Andrew W. Mellon Foundation for Museum and Library Collaboration

Smith has been awarded a \$165,000 grant from **The Andrew W. Mellon Foundation** to support collaborative planning among campus libraries and museum staff to design a new digital asset management (DAM) ecosystem. Once implemented, the DAM will provide clearer research pathways for students and faculty and greater online access to the college's unique collections.

National Domestic Workers Alliance

Jennifer Guglielmo and Michelle Joffroy will embark on a two-year collaboration with the **National Domestic**Workers Alliance (NDWA) to contribute to the visibility of the domestic work sector and its history. They are working closely with NDWA to create a multilingual, smartphone-accessible digital timeline on the history of domestic worker organizing, as well as a paired curriculum and videos, to educate NDWA's staff, membership, supporters, and the larger public on the histories and cultures of domestic work and domestic worker organizing in and beyond the United States. They received a grant of \$1,056,334 for this project.

Information on COS Pivot

The Corporate and Foundation Relations Office encourages you to use COS Pivot, a grant research tool. COS Pivot is a research funding opportunities database that allows faculty and researchers to find research opportunities and funding. Pivot combines a comprehensive, editorially maintained database of 28,000 funding opportunities with a unique database of prepopulated scholar profiles. Faculty have the ability to create, edit, or "claim" personal profiles and get funding updates. We encourage you to sign in by creating your Pivot account. Once your account is created, Pivot will provide you with global and local connections to strengthen your research, and you will be able to explore new avenues for funding and collaboration.

Just click on it, and you will be automatically logged on and can start searching over 108,000 funders and 177 federal funders.
