The total undergraduate student enrollment in fall 2022 was 2566 of which 33.9% identify as domestic students of color, 14.2% are international, 18% are first-generation, and 57.2% receive need-based aid. Students are also diverse in terms of age, ability and disability, religion, and veteran status, among other dimensions of identity.
